What are the entry requirements?

An undergraduate degree at class 2:2 or above, or equivalent.

Grade 4 (C) or above in English, maths and science, or equivalent qualification.

We consider candidates with pending GCSEs.

We consider candidates who need to take a GCSE equivalency test in English, Maths or Science.



Personal qualities

Personal qualities we are looking for include:

- energy and passion.
- excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- commitment and passion for subject specialism.
- ability to inspire and enthuse.
- good organisation.
- imagination and creativity.
- confidence, resilience, and flexibility.

Other requirements

Applicants must meet the Department for Education's Initial Teacher Training criteria, which means being medically fit and successfully completing an enhanced disclosure via the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and satisfying any other safeguarding checks required for this course.

What to expect?

The main placement school is Trinity High School. Our trainees will be in school with us for four days a week and will be involved in all aspects of a teacher's work. One day a week there will be pedagogical training, which will be a combination of specific 'Subject Studies' sessions and more general 'Professional Studies' session. These will take place at different school involved in the SCITT.

There will also be a second, shorter school placement at a contrasting school, in the spring term.

What is the interview process?

You will be required to attend one interview, either face-to-face or online. Interviews include:

- exploration of curriculum knowledge
- discussion about relevant experiences
- a presentation or small teaching exercise
- written task (English and Maths)
- formal interview

We will also be looking for:

- good communication skills.
- potential / suitability to be a good teacher.
- robustness to cope with the demands of the course.

Full details of the application process will be sent to applicants who have successfully progressed to this stage.

Can I get any financial support?

You could be eligible for a bursary of up to £28,000. To be eligible you'll need a 2:2 degree in an eligible subject. You do not need to apply for a bursary. If you're eligible, you'll automatically start receiving it when you start the course.

You may also be eligible for a student loan. These are normally for undergraduate courses, but you can also apply if you do postgraduate teacher training. [Find out how much loan you could get using the student finance calculator.](#)
