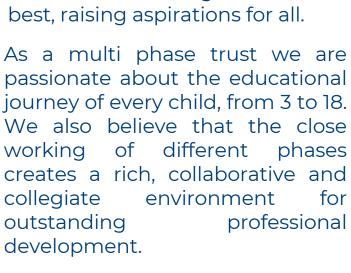

Train to Teach: Primary

What to expect?

During the training year you will spend the majority of your time based at one of our Primary schools and a shorter placement in a local middle school, alongside experienced teachers and leaders. One day a week you will attend training. These days will focus on professional studies, core curriculum (English, Maths and Science) and foundation subject pedagogy.

At the beginning of the year you will observe expert practitioners, moving towards leading small parts of a lesson and gradually building up to teach whole lessons. You will receive the support of school-based mentors/class teachers, as well as members of the BCTSA Central Team and specialists. The wellbeing of our trainees is very important to us and we take pride in the personalised provision we offer.

What are the entry requirements?

- An undergraduate degree at class 2:2 or above, or equivalent.
- Grade 4 (C) or above in English, maths and science, or equivalent.
- We will consider candidates with pending GCSEs.
- We will consider candidates who need to take a GCSE equivalency test in English, maths or science.

What are the costs of the course?

We offer both full and part time courses. Full time, I year PGCE plus QTS is £9,535







Train to Teach: Secondary

What to expect?

You will be based at one of our High Schools 4 days a week where you will be fully involved in all aspects of a teacher's work. One day a week you will have your pedagogical training, which will provide a mixture of specific Subject Studies and more general Professional Studies sessions.

To enrich your professional practice and develop your expertise you will complete 2 PGCE assignments, which will contribute 60 credits towards a Master's degree.

You will be based at this school for the whole programme, except for a second contrasting placement, which will take place in the Spring term. This placement school will be discussed with you before any decisions are made.

What are the entry requirements?

- An undergraduate degree at class 2:2 or above, or equivalent.
- Grade 4 (C) or above in English and maths, or equivalent qualification.
- We will consider candidates with pending GCSEs.
- We will consider candidates who need to take a GCSE equivalency test in English or maths.

What are the costs of the course?

We offer both full and part time courses.
Full time, 1 year PGCE plus QTS £9,535







Core Content Training Programme

A typical week will look like this:

1 day training	4 days on placement in school

Each week will be structured to develop one of the 5 curriculum core themes:

- 1. Behaviour Management
- 2. Subject and Curriculum
- 3. Pedagogy
- 4. Assessment
- 5. Professional Behaviours and Part 2 of the Teachers' Standards

The curriculum is designed to revisit themes multiple times throughout the year to enable you to introduce, embed, and then extend learning. In the final 6 weeks of the programme, you will not have training days, but instead will spend 5 days per week in school, teaching an 80% timetable, in order to prepare for ECT teaching.





PGCE with QTS: Bath Spa University

PGCE (Postgraduate Certificate of Education)

We are working with Bath Spa University to provide the PGCE element of our course. The SCITT PGCE aims to provide you with structured opportunities to explore what educational research says about the classroom, school and the educational system as a whole. It is intended to make you pause, think, analyse, explore, reflect and question. This is made up of 60 Level 7 Masters credits; each assignment aims to extend your understanding of a key aspect of school life and will involve you in some in-depth analysis of professional practice as a developing teacher.

The PGCE is made up of 2 assignments, each worth 30 credits. The course is delivered online.

Each assignment is assessed through 3 elements:

- 2000 word written essay
- 15 minute recorded presentation
- Portfolio of evidence

Module 1: pedagogy focus

You will explore how the learning of pupils can be planned for and developed within different lessons. In doing so, you will use and evaluate pedagogic approaches to teaching, considering the impact that these can have n enabling pupils to learn.

Module 2: adaptive teaching focus

You will explore how adaptive teaching can create inclusive classrooms in schools, so that all pupils can be supported in their learning.

Financial Support

To be eligible for a bursary you'll need a 2:2 degree in any subject. You do not need to apply for a bursary. If you're eligible, you'll automatically start receiving it when you start the course. You may also be eligible for a student loan.

These are normally for undergraduate courses but you can also apply if you do postgraduate teacher training.

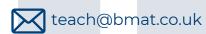
